TAX AND GIFT AID At the APCM our Treasurer, David Oldale, appealed for all those donors who pay tax to consider agreeing to sign a gift aid form so that the Church, which is a registered charity, can claim back tax which means the donation is increased by 25%. If you have already signed a gift aid form, then that will last as long as you pay sufficient tax. If you have any questions please have a word with David Oldale. Whilst on the subject of Gift Aid, please note that other organisations associated with our churches (e.g. Hope House) cannot claim tax back.

GOD'S KINGDOM IS STRONGER THAN THE STORMS CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 13-19 MAY 2018

This year's focus is on the people of Haiti, who are still struggling from the devastation caused by Hurricane Matthew in September 2016. People like Marcelin lost everything. He has three teenage daughters who he can no longer afford to send to school and they often go hungry. Christian Aid is helping families like this through its local partners, particularly focussing on building secure housing to withstand any further hurricane damage.

Volunteers from churches have collected house to house during Christian Aid Week since it began more than 60 years ago. Could you help us do the same this Christian Aid Week? There are a few rounds left in St Thomas' parish on the table at the back of church. Each envelope delivered sends a message about Jesus' love and justice – which proclaims good news to the poor. Each envelope collected will help someone living in extreme poverty to protect them if a disaster strikes. £50 could buy basic building tools to help people build secure homes.

You can donate via the red envelopes (available at the back of church and in the Centre— please don't forget to Gift Aid if you can); via the Christian aid website www.caweek.org or by calling the free phone number 08080 006006. There will be a retiring collection at all three services on 13th May (please use the red envelope).

Jesus challenges us to love our neighbour. Will you answer His call this Christian Aid Week?
